

College Financing Night In School Auditorium Jan. 7

Glenbrook South High School will host a College Financing Night at 7 p.m., Wednesday, January 7, Watson Auditorium. This program is for parents of junior and senior students and will provide an array of information, plus practical help in filling out Financial Aid forms. The program will be presented by financial aid directors from area colleges and universities.

The College Financing Night will begin at 7 p.m. with a brief opening session by Gloria Mueller in the Auditorium. From 7:15-8:15 p.m., parents will have the choice of attending three different workshops. Mike Dessimoz, associate VP/ Enrollment Services, Roosevelt University, will address several topics about college financing in the North West Cafeteria.

His topics include: "financing college - where to begin," "how the process works," and "alternatives in college financing." There will also be a question and answer period. Angela Yang, director of Financial Aid Operations, Northwestern University, will present a workshop for junior parents in the auditorium, and Jerry Cebrzynski, director of Financial Aid, Lake Forest College, will conduct a session on completing the financial aid forms in the Student Activities Center.

In addition, Mark O'Brien, assistant principal, Pupil Personnel Services, and the GBS counseling staff will participate. The counselors are Erika Alonso, Matthew Drone, Ellen Eichler, Paul Herzog, John Klasen, Karen Klebba, Ann

A veritable army of volunteers from Interact Club and Cerebral Palsy swiftly processed the donations as a steady stream of cars headed into GBS to drop off donations.
