The Assistive Technology Exchange Network upgrades and refurbishes donated computers and other computer-related equipment and distributes it to requesting Illinois schools.

UCP's Reedswood School will receive computers and other technology devices from the network in exchange for serving as a drop-off location for equipment and software that businesses and individuals are no longer using.

Donors are provided with documentation of their gift for tax purposes. Equipment in working order is preferred.

Donations will be accepted between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

A special drop-off time will be from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday and from 10 a.m. to noon Sunday at the school, 311 S. Reed St.
