Acceptable electronics for the drive are: computers (PC Pentium or Apple G3 or higher), printers, modems, 3.5 disk drives, peripherals, keyboards, cords and cables, cell phones, hard drives, monitors, original software, mouse, fax machines. Acceptable durable medical equipment includes: canes, walkers, standers, crutches, wheelchairs and therapeutic equipment.
